Government CIO wins lifetime award

he Public Sector Digital Transformation Awards were held at the Round Room of the Mansion House on Thursday, October 10. Hosted by broadcaster Ivan Yates, the awards recognised and celebrated excellence and innovation in the delivery of public sector digital transformation. They showcased cutting-edge technologies and innovative approaches that have made a real impact, improved service delivery, and enhanced citizen experiences. The evening was attended by over 400 guests and the diverse range of categories and organisations shortlisted highlighted transformation using big data, AI, cloud technology, health technology and sustainable innovation to name a few.

The awards were judged by panel of industry experts including: Aislinn Gannon, client director, 4OC

As well as the 15 nominated awards, the judging panel also awarded a Lifetime Achievement Award to a seasoned leader in the industry worthy of distinct acknowledgement.

This year's Lifetime Achievement Award recipient was Barry Lowry, Government chief information officer, Office of the Government CIO, Department of Public Expenditure, NDP Delivery and Reform. Barry has been a lifelong public servant and has worked in government in a variety of roles for more than 40 years. He began his career in Northern Ireland Civil Service. In April 2016, Barry became the chief information officer for the Irish government. In this role, his focus is on developing the government's digital agenda to better serve the people of Ireland and ensuring that Ireland is well placed to influence and exemplify the EU's digital ambitions. The judges noted that Barry has revolutionised the culture of digital government in Ireland and continues to

be a driving force in the digital transformation of the Irish public service, making the Office of the Government CIO one of the key enablers of transformation across the civil and public service today.
